

Four Area Congregations Chose the Garden of Remembrance in 2007



Each season has its own unique beauty at the Garden of Remembrance.

During the last year, four greater Washington area Jewish congregations selected the Garden of Remembrance as their official cemetery, bringing the current total of participating congregations to nineteen. The newest congregations to offer their members burial sites are Congregation Beth El of Montgomery County, Congregation Bet Chesed, Chabad Shul of Potomac and Young Israel • Ezras Israel of Potomac.

Conservative, Reform and Orthodox, the diversity of these newly participating congregations demonstrates the inclusive nature of the Memorial Park. One Reconstructionist congregation also has a section at the Garden of Remembrance, and there are sections reserved for those unaffiliated with a congregation.

Since the year of its founding by the inspired leaders of Washington Hebrew Congregation, the Garden of Remembrance has grown as a symbol of a unified community, the site of traditional ceremonies that bring people together to reflect and remember, a serene place where the living can draw strength and comfort from the quiet beauty of nature.
